# navigating your library


## Navigating Your Library

**Library Cards** Cards are free to anyone who lives or works in Maryland. You may also be eligible if you live in a neighboring jurisdiction. Out-of-state residents may obtain a card for a one-time fee of \$40. Proof of name and address required.

**Borrowing Items** Patrons may check out up to 75 items per card, including DVDs. Most books, CDs, and audiobooks may be borrowed for three weeks (21 days). Express Books, most DVDs, magazines, Playaway Views, and video games check out for 7 days. Express DVDs check out for 3 days.

FCPL books may be returned to any branch and the Bookmobile. Book drops are open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Materials can be sent between FCPL branches by regular delivery service. Most items can be renewed up to five times unless someone else has reserved them.

**Fines and Fees** All items returned or renewed after the due date are charged overdue fines of 25 cents per day, per item. Maximum fines apply based on replacement cost. If items are lost or



damaged, the account will be charged a replacement cost plus processing fee for each item. An unpaid fine/fee of \$20 or more blocks a library card. Visit fcpl.org for a complete list of library policies. Find us @FredCoLibrary!

### We're thrilled to announce that we've had some recent updates!

As you're reading through this issue of *Bookmarks*, you'll notice the most obvious change to our program listing. This section is now organized by age and theme, but still maintains all of the exciting programs you've come to know and love.

Updates abound beyond just *Bookmarks*, though. Both Urbana Regional Library and Emmitsburg Branch Library received a number of upgrades in response to requests received by patrons. "Urbana Regional Library refreshed the library interior to provide more study tables, reading areas, and a new and improved circulation desk in order to serve you better," states Amy Whitney, Urbana Regional Library Branch Administrator. "These changes are in response to high demand for more quiet study and reading space."

Erin Dingle, Emmitsburg Branch Administrator, adds, "The Emmitsburg Branch features new furniture and bright new colors in the Teen Area, which gives our young people a fun, comfortable place to visit. In addition to those changes, look for more programs and event offerings for tweens and teens."

The adult department at the Emmitsburg Branch will also be receiving an upgrade. "Look for our brighter, open spaces and new furniture. And, don't forget about our improved computer area when visiting the library," says Dingle.

## Kareem Abdul-Jabbar

#### NBA all-time leading scorer, bestselling author, and U.S. Cultural Ambassador

The all-time leading scorer and a six-time NBA champion, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar is best known for changing the face of professional basketball. A triumphant CML Leukemia cancer survivor, he became a global icon for his work off the court as an activist and bestselling author. His most recent book, *Writings on the Wall—Searching for a New Equality Beyond Black and White*, offers his personal perspective on the current political landscape. An HBO documentary detailing his career entitled *Kareem: Minority of One* was released in late 2015 to universal acclaim. A regular contributing columnist for *The Washington Post* and *Time Magazine*, Abdul-Jabbar serves as the founder and chairman of the Skyhook Foundation, which brings innovative outdoor environmental learning to underserved students. In 2012, he was appointed a U.S. Cultural Ambassador by then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton; today, he continues to be a force for change, engaging audiences nationwide as he details his exciting evolution from street ball player to successful athlete and activist.

## **Elizabeth Smart**

#### Abduction survivor, motivational speaker, and bestselling author

The 2002 abduction of Elizabeth Smart was one of the most followed child abduction cases of our time. Taken from her family home and held captive for nine months before being rescued, Smart chose to let her experiences define her—in a positive way. In the years after her rescue, Smart transformed from victim to advocate, traveling the country and working to educate, inspire, and foster change. Now, she shares her incredible story of perseverance in the face of unimaginable adversity, offering a lasting message about hope and stopping the brutal victimization of women and children around the world. The founder of the Elizabeth Smart Foundation, she has helped to promote the National AMBER Alert, the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act, and other safety legislation to help prevent abductions. With an insightful nature and bright spirit, Smart strives to motivate parents, law enforcement, and leaders worldwide to focus on children's safety.





### First doctor to discover and diagnose chronic brain damage in NFL athletes

Portrayed by famed actor Will Smith in the 2015 film *Concussion*, Omalu details the challenges he faced taking on the NFL and sports industry to ensure that the truth—and risk—of chronic brain damage was understood, accepted, and prevented at all costs. A forensic pathologist, neuropathologist, and epidemiologist, Omalu reveals the biases and obstacles he overcame as an African immigrant staunchly committed to studying medicine in the United States, ultimately rising to the top of his field against all odds.


# spelling bee



# <mark>museum</mark>s by candlelight



On December 10, join the Maryland Room for Museums by Candlelight, the annual holiday celebration of the Frederick Historic Sites Consortium. Local authors, including Jim Rada and Bob O'Connor, will be present for the vearly author showcase. Books will be on sale, and writers will be on hand to discuss and sign their work. Enjoy a harp and flugelhorn concert at 1 p.m., and model trains running in the C. Burr Artz Trust Room throughout the day. And, don't forget to make your way to the Edward F. Fry Library at Point of Rocks on the 10<sup>th</sup> to hear former NPS Ranger Susan Burke present a history of the National Park Service.

In conjunction with Museums by Candlelight, the Maryland Room will host Artifacts of Outlander, a traveling exhibit from Maryland's Jefferson Patterson Park and Museum. Based on the wildly

popular book and television series by Diana Gabaldon, the exhibit features a Scotland bristling under English political control in the 1740s. By that time, Maryland had been an English colony for 100 years, and Frederick County had iust been established. Colonial artifacts found by archaeologists in Maryland are therefore not so different than ones found in 1740s Scotland. Some amazing finds from colonial Maryland will be taken out of storage to show how they compare to the 18<sup>th</sup>-century Scotland depicted in Outlander. The display features horse tack, drinking glasses, firearms, clothing fasteners, wig hair curlers, and rare organic survivals such as 18<sup>th</sup>-century corks and leather. 



For all those non-fiction lovers, nature enthusiasts, or readers who can't commit to a long book, I highly recommend *The Sound of a Wild Snail Eating* by Elisabeth Tova Bailey. It is a charmingly written and fascinating investigation into not only the natures of mollusca but also the complexities of life.

I am also an avid young adult reader, and my two favorites for fall and winter

are *Phantom Limbs* by Paula Garner and *The Forgetting* by Sharon Cameron. *Phantom Limbs* is a complex novel about loss, amputation both literal and metaphorical, and connectedness. *The Forgetting* is a terrific book for fans of *Divergent* or *The Hunger Games*. It is part dystopia, part science fiction with a splash of romance and lots of action!

As for general fiction, I am obsessed with a stunning book called *I Will Send Rain* by Rae Meadows. Her small novel sweeps readers into 1934 rural Oklahoma and through a town suffering from the effects of the Dust Bowl. The small cast of characters are endearing and their troubles tangible. As they struggle to survive, their faith and love is tested.

A book I just finished and can't stop recommending is *Rolling Blackouts: Dispatches from Turkey, Syria, and Iraq,* a graphic novel by Sarah Glidden. She does a great job of untangling the situation in the Middle East and, more importantly, explaining what some of these conflicts mean for civilians in the region. Glidden also explores the idea of how, in telling a

story, journalists and writers become part of the story.

For me, non-fiction graphic novels have been a great entry point to some pretty weighty topics. I've learned about everything from economic theory (*Economix: How and Why Our Economy Works and Doesn't Work* by Michael Goodwin) to basic neuroscience (*Neurocomic* by Hana Ros) and read some remarkable histories (*Drowned City: Hurricane Katrina and New Orleans* by Don Brown) and compelling memoirs (*Fun Home* by Alison Bechdel).

What I like about graphic novels is that they share so much in common with film. The visual storytelling can be very powerful. Like movie directors, authors have to decide how to frame a shot in a way that best moves the narrative forward. When it is done well, graphic novels have a way of letting us in, of making complex situations or emotions more immediate, accessible, and relatable.

Next up for me is volume two of Ed Piskor's *Hip Hop Family Tree,* an entertaining multi-volume history of the genre.
