This year's Summer Reading Club takes young readers in exciting new directions to discover the sights, sounds, and wonders of the world, both near and far.

Focused on the themes of "One World, Many Stories" (preschool through fifth grade) and "You Are Here" (middle and high school), the Summer Reading Club is a treasure trove of programs, activities, and special events that encourages participants to explore their local communities and distant lands. Magic shows, crafts, movies, up-close animal adventures, art from around the world, and cultural performances—including a Polynesian Island dance party—fill the summer with nonstop fun and enrichment.

Participants can go paperfree and track their Summer Reading Club progress online at [fcpl.org/src](http://fcpl.org/src), where there's also space for writing and posting reviews and compiling a personalized reading list based on other book reviews. Also available online are Collaborative Summer Reading Booklists, compiled by media specialists from Frederick County Public Schools and FCPL staff. Lists are divided into four groups by grade levels (K-2nd, 3rd-5th, 6th-8th, and 9th-12th) and designed to open the door to exciting reading and reduce "summer learning loss."

## READY, SET, EXPLORE...AND WIN

“This year’s Summer Reading Club theme celebrates the stories of who we are, where we came from, and where we are going,” explains Robyn Monaco, Children’s Supervisor at C. Burr Artz. “Each branch will host its own unique and fun programs, so we’re hoping that patrons will enjoy traveling to each library.” Summer Reading Club participants will receive a passport after registration that can then be entered into a special prize drawing after being stamped at all eight FCPL branches.

Participants who register for the Summer Reading Club by July 31 are eligible to win:

## REASONS FOR READING

Don't tell the kids, but FCPL's Summer Reading Club isn't just for fun. Children and teens who read more over the summer reduce the learning loss that occurs when school is not in session, plus they develop positive, lifelong reading habits.

According to a Dominican University Study in 2010, students who participated in the public library's summer reading program scored higher on reading achievement tests at the beginning of the next school year than those students who did not participate. Research from the National Summer Learning Association shows that:

- All young people experience learning losses when they do not engage in educational activities during the summer.
- Low-income students lose more than two months in reading achievement.
- Parents consistently cite summer as the most difficult time to ensure that their children have productive things to do.

"For many children and teens, the library is their home away from home throughout the summer because we have so many things to do," states Janet Vogel, Children's Services Supervisor at Thurmont Regional Library. "I love to see so many coming to the library and enjoying our programs, books, magazines, and DVDs—and seeing all of the books that kids and teens are reading when they show us their reading logs."

## GROW UP GREAT WITH PNC

It's the perfect match—FCPL's Summer Reading Club and PNC's Grow Up Great, a 10-year, \$100-million program designed to help prepare children age 0 to 5, particularly those who are underserved, for success in school and life.

"PNC has been a Summer Reading Club sponsor for two years, and it's a partnership with tremendous value for children throughout Frederick County," explains FCPL Director Darrell Batson. In addition to funding, PNC provides volunteer support through its employees, who help with Summer Reading Club programs at FCPL branches countywide. ## CELEBRATE SUMMER AT URBANA MUSIC FESTIVAL SATURDAY, JUNE 25

Now in its third year, the Urbana Music Festival returns—bigger and better than ever—on Saturday, June 25, from 12 to 6 pm at Urbana Regional Library. The annual celebration of music, art, and summer continues to grow with food vendors, crafters, special guests, and fun activities for all ages. The popular event is produced in partnership with the Villages of Urbana Homeowners Association.

"All of us at the library are very happy to have played a part in getting this annual event started," states Erin Dingle, Interim Urbana Branch Administrator. "Our library patrons look forward to it as a day to celebrate summer, visit with friends and neighbors on the plaza in front of our building, and listen to some good music. The festival also attracts people who haven't visited our library yet so it's a nice day to welcome them."

Festival-goers can enjoy rides provided by Bar-T Mountainside Challenge and Retreat Center, a 10:30 am performance by signing storyteller Kathy McMillan, and special visits from the Frederick Keys' mascot, Keyote, as well as the Cookie Monster. Food and other amusements will be available throughout the day.

Of course, front and center at the festival is the music. This year's lineup includes:

### **Rhodes Tavern Troubadours** 12 – 1:30 pm

Always a crowd-pleaser, this award-winning band from Washington, DC, is known for its dynamic brand of original roots rock music, including two rock CDs for kids.

### **Tommy Lepson Band** 2 – 3:30 pm

Rhythm-and-blues classics, new versions of obscure gems, and originals that blend American roots music with Latin percussion. . . this band plays it all.

### **The Freddie Long Band** 4 – 6 pm

Frederick County native Freddie Long comes home—with his band—to perform his signature blend of pop, rock, and soul. Since launching in 2005, The Freddie Long Band has played throughout the East Coast and earned numerous awards.

## WOODSBORO BANK FUELS BOOKMOBILE SUCCESS

Woodsboro Bank President and CEO Rick Miller understands the importance of numbers—and words. “Literacy is a key factor in every community’s social well-being and economic success,” he explains. “With cutbacks in educational funding and a county population that is constantly on the rise, it is vital that literacy be emphasized—particularly among pre-school age children.”

Miller’s passion for literacy is echoed by Woodsboro Bank’s sponsorship of FCPL’s Bookmobile services for 2011–2012. The Bookmobile, which makes 16 stops throughout the county every two weeks, served 53,000-plus patrons last year. The Early

Start Bookmobile, which served more than 23,500 children last year, visits 72 pre-school facilities each month, providing not only library materials but also an on-site storytime.

“It is widely believed that a child’s intellectual development is at its greatest during the first five years of life,” says Miller, citing studies that show children who have been read aloud to routinely since birth will start ahead and typically remain ahead academically in school and have higher SAT scores, regardless of household income. “We at Woodsboro Bank are proud to sponsor and invest in these two programs that will ultimately help shape the future of our county,” he states.

## ON MY NIGHTSTAND

**Andrew Roberts**

*The Age of Wonder* by Richard Holmes

This book is a sweeping look at the scientific renaissance in Britain during the late 1700s. It is a fascinating examination of the work and motivations of folks like Joseph Banks and William Herschel. Banks was the botanist on Captain Cook's journey of discovery around the world (including an extended stay in Tahiti and his immersion in the island's exotic culture).
